⁽²⁾ The term "Challengers" is being used to avoid potential confusion with Equivalency numbers issued to tradespersons deemed as "equivalent" to a certified tradesperson. Challengers credential count was amended in February 2007 to include credentials issued to challengers (including no exam/no Inter Provincial Standard Endorsement (IPSE) and no exam/with IPSE).
