

MOBILE CRANE OPERATOR

Occupation Description

“Mobile Crane Operator” means a person who operates a mobile crane to perform lifts and hoists, sets up cranes, takes down cranes, and plans lifts and crane procedures.

Pathways to Certification

In BC, an individual can become certified as a Mobile Crane Operator by completing the Mobile Crane Operator program or by challenging the certification. All crane operators must be registered BC Crane Safety prior to applying for ITA apprenticeship registration. Apprenticeship programs are for individuals who have an employer to sponsor them and challenge programs are for individuals who have extensive experience working in the occupation and wish to challenge the certification.

Youth can begin an apprenticeship in high school through the Youth Train in Trades or Youth Work in Trades programs. The Youth Work in Trades program is available for any trade if an employer is willing to sponsor the student. Trades offered through the Youth Train in Trades vary by region; contact your local school district to find out which technical training programs are being offered through the Youth Train in Trades program in your region.

Foundation programs, where available, provide adults and youth who do not have work experience or employer sponsorship with an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills needed to enter the occupation. Individuals who wish to enroll in a Foundation program must register directly with the training provider.

Recommended Education

The following education is recommended for apprentices entering this occupation. These are not prerequisites, but rather a desired level of skill or knowledge that will contribute to success in the industry.

- Grade 12 or equivalent

BC Crane Safety Registration

BC Crane Safety registration is required for all crane operators in British Columbia. Registration forms are available on the BC Crane Safety website at www.bccranesafety.ca.

ITA Registration

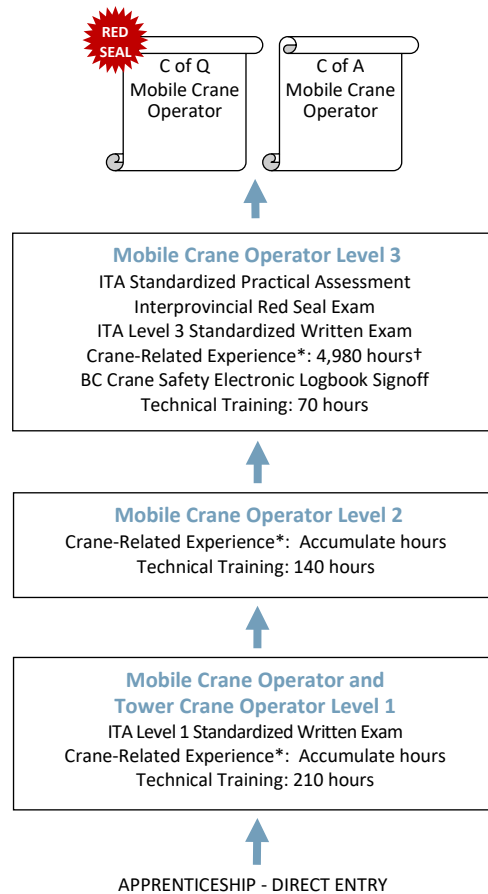
Individuals who wish to begin an apprenticeship in this program must register with ITA along with their sponsor. Application forms for all programs are available from the ITA website. Online registration is also available for most programs through the ITA website.

Those who wish to challenge the Mobile Crane Operator certification must complete the Mobile Crane Operator Challenge Application and submit it to ITA. Challenge applications are assessed for proof of workplace hours and scope of experience prior to acceptance of the individual into the challenge pathway.

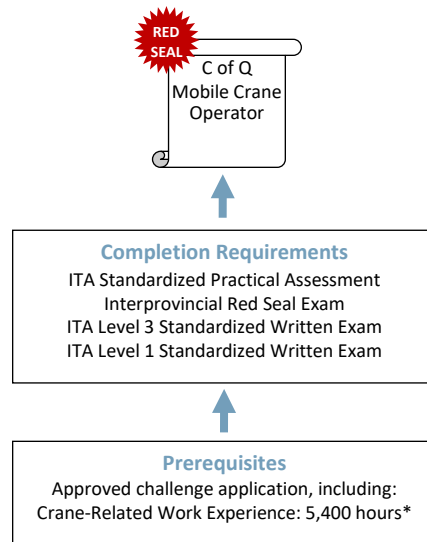

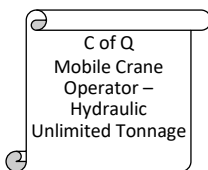

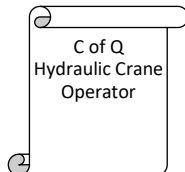

Credentials Awarded Mobile Crane Operator – Certificate of Qualification with Interprovincial Red Seal endorsement

ITA Registration Prerequisites An approved Challenge Application, which includes:

- Minimum of 5,400 documented hours of directly-related experience working in the occupation. Must include a minimum of 1,600 hours of crane operating time. Of the 1,600 operating hours, a minimum of 400 hours must be accumulated on one or more of:
 - Mobile lattice friction equipment
 - Mobile lattice hydraulic equipment
 - Mobile hydraulic equipment with capacity greater than 80 tonnes
- Documented evidence of achievement of the competencies listed in the ITA Mobile Crane Operator Challenge Application
